Project records now entered in DiVA

DiVA now contains BETA-versions of BTH projects from Vinnova, the Swedish Energy Agency, Forte, the Research Council for Health, Work Life and Welfare, the Research Council Formas and the Riksbankens jubileumsfond.

36 project records from 2007 to 2018 have been imported from the Swedish Research Council's database SweCRIS. Please note that only project manager information can be found in SweCRIS. Information about other project members is not included. During the second half of 2020 we hope to link relevant research publications to the new project items plus additional BTH project members. It is not yet determined if projects that are not included in SweCRIS, e.g. local projects or projects supported by other research funders, should be added. I am happy to receive your opinion on this matter. Is there a need among researchers and administrative staff to have a broader overview of project records with information about BTH participants and produced publications?

Open Science workshop 29th of September at BTH

How to communicate your research as well as knowledge about how to involve, engage and collaborate with stakeholders and end-users are important skills.

To know how to manage communication throughout a project lifecycle is a necessity also for future funding applications. Some aspects of Open Science are requirements in the European Commission's research and innovation program Horizon 2020, its successor Horizon Europe, as well as in national programs and calls for proposals.

In this workshop we will discuss the basic principles of Open Science and how you can apply them to your work. You will get an overview of the main aspects of Open Science such as; open access, open data, science communication, public engagement and citizen science. Through group discussions and practical exercises, you will get tips on how to create a data management plan, communicate your research and how to involve and engage different stakeholders in your project or research.
