Search for journals with prepaid APC – new resource for BTH-authors: [here!](#)

The library has signed several open access publishing agreements where the publishing fee is either reduced or fully prepaid for BTH researchers who publish open access.

When you have decided to publish open access, you might need to consider what journal to send your manuscript to. In this new resource you can search for journals where you can publish open access without fees. The cost is already covered by the library. Use the search box to search for a specific journal or a subject to find a title that is included in an open access agreement with prepaid publishing fees. Included journals will link to more information about the agreement and author instructions. Note that you need to be the **corresponding author** in order to take advantage of the prepaid Article Processing Charge.

Certified data management

The work with getting research data management in Swedish higher education institutions certified according to CoreTrustSeal has begun.

It is a Swedish National Data Service (SND) pilot project and Karolinska Institutet (KI), Chalmers, RISE and Bolin Centre at Stockholm University are the first four organizations to take part in the project. The purpose with this certification is to get a validation that the research data management is sustainable throughout the research process, so that the data remain as open and reusable as possible. Apart from being certified another purpose is to investigate which certification requirements can be met with shared solutions from SND, solutions we hope take advantage of in the future.
