Eva Norling is responsible for the course Information Retrieval for PhD students and negotiates with publishers on transformative literature agreements to support open access publishing.


Contact Anette Pettersson about printing doctoral and licentiate theses, and publishing them on DiVA. You can also contact her if you want to publish a BTH research report.



## POLICY FOR RESEARCH DATA AT BTH HAS BEEN APPROVED

**Board of Governors approved the Policy for research data at BTH on December 15th.**

With the Policy BTH aims to share research data as open as possible and in accordance to the FAIR principles. The Policy is a step towards the Swedish government goal for public funded research data to be open by year 2026. The Data Access Unit (DAU) will continue working on getting the Guidelines finalized at the beginning of next year.



## UNESCO RECOMMENDATION ON OPEN SCIENCE.

Until today, there was no universal definition of open science and standards existed only at regional, national or institutional levels. In adopting the Recommendation, 193 countries have agreed to abide by common standards for open science.
